
LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: PROGRAMS FOR ADULTS & SENIORS



LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: LOCAL AUTHOR NIGHT




LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: GARDEN CLUB


- The Mildred Whipple Library Garden Club meets the second Saturday of every month from 12 PM to 1 PM.

Bring your extra seedlings and/or rooted cuttings of culinary herbs to trade. May 10: Summer garden plant swap. Bring your extra vegetable and flower seedlings and/or rooted cuttings to trade. 




Looking Forward


Coming up the District has several more community collaborations scheduled and in the planning stage.


LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: ARSL ANNUAL CONFERENCE




- Three members of the NDLD staff traveled to Springfield, Massachusets, for the Association for Rural & Small Libraries annual conference. This was a full week of learning & networking with other librarians & library vendors from around the nation. This year there were over 1,000 attendees representing all 50 states.
- Combined, staff attended over 50 events & sessions. Our staff brought back programming for all ages, new resources, & new project ideas, including: outreach, accessibility, readers' advisory tools, staff training, policies, community partnerships, available grants, & new digital resources (coming soon!). Staff also attended a Massachusetts author event & added 8 new authors for all ages & reading interests to our shelves.
- In addition to attending conference sessions, one staff member is part of the ARSL Leadership Institute, which is a 2-year program limited to 30 individuals out of a national pool of candidates. A second staff member presented on our library's adult nonfiction reorganization in a virtual recorded session. It is currently the most-viewed of the 18 recorded sessions & is available to all attendees until December.
- ARSL is one of the largest associations our library is part of & we're very excited to have two of our staff selected to represent the North Douglas Library District nationally.







LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: SUMMER READING 2024 WRAP UP

- Summer Reading 2024 wrapped up on September 4 with our 7th annual Family Night. This year the North Douglas Library District partnered with the North Douglas School District to host after school crafts and snacks from 3:30 to 5 PM and then hosted Dragon Theater Puppets for entertainment for the whole family. The library also gave away free books and door prizes.
- This program ran from June through the end of August and over 500 participants off all ages attended a Summer Reading event over the course of the summer. Summer Reading participants read over 55,000 minutes, or over 930 hours, this summer!
- The library handed out over 50 weekly prizes this year. Grand prize winners for each age group will be announced on Tuesday, September 10.

LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: ADULT NONFICTION CATEGORIES



- Adult Nonfiction has a new look! Titles in this section are now reorganized into 20 categories with unique, highly visible stickers to improve the collection's accessibility & usability. Both the Children's Nonfiction & Young Adult Nonfiction sections have already been reorganized & have received extremely positive feedback.
- When browsing on the shelves, each category is divided alphabetically into subcategories to help patrons find the topic they are looking for. Each title's category & subcategory is also marked in the library's catalog to help patrons quickly find materials.
- Adult Nonfiction categories expand on categories already in use in other nonfiction areas & were created through patron feedback & current materials.
- Custom labels were designed by library staff: each label includes unique, distinct designs to help convey information.
