

LIBRARY IMPROVEMENTS

The North Douglas Library District had a busy and productive year! Here are just a few of things we've done since July 2023:

TWEEN COLLECTION

In July 2023 the Mildred Whipple Library added a new collection geared for readers ready to transition from the children's to teen sections. This "**in beTWEEN**" collection contains both older children's fiction and younger teen fiction titles. This collection has its own shelving location next to the teen area & unique teal labels at the top of each book spine.

OREGON AUTHORS

Local authors are increasingly highlighted in the library's collections. Books are labeled with an "Oregon Author" sticker on their spine and searchable in the library's online catalog.

YOUNG ADULT & ADULT NONFICTION CATEGORIES

Both the Young Adult and Adult nonfiction sections were reorganized into new categories with new, clearly visible spine label stickers. Categories were created based on prior work in our Children's nonfiction, patron request, & current collection subjects. Staff have received extremely positive feedback from patrons on increased visibility of books on the shelf & ease & intuitiveness for finding books of interest.

<u>COMMUNITY SEED LIBRARY</u>

The Community Seed Library launched during winter 2024 and is a free program committed to supporting community gardeners of all ages and experience levels. The Community Seed Library seeks to inspire local gardeners by providing free access to open-pollinated and heirloom seeds; supporting and connecting our community through gardening-related programming, resources, and education; and promoting biodiversity, sustainability, and greater food security through seed saving and sharing.

BOOK DELIVERY

The North Douglas Library District provides FREE monthly book deliveries to any NDLD cardholder living within the North Douglas Library District boundaries who is unable to make regular open hours for any reason. New books are dropped off on the porch at a scheduled time and waiting library returns are picked up. Participants sign up by contacting the library.

LIBRARY CONFERENCES

The North Douglas Library District continued to prioritize staff training this past year. In September 2023, several staff attended the virtual portion of the Association for Rural & Small Libraries annual national conference. In April 2024, five library staff and two board members attended the Oregon Library Association's annual state conference. Staff brought back numerous ideas for programs and library resources from both conferences as they they attended sessions on a range of library topics, networked with other libraries in Oregon and the U.S., and made connections with library-related vendors.
